A New Light for a New Year

It is the middle of August and I am reflecting on what message I want you to hear from me on Rosh HaShanah, the beginning of the New Year 5772. In front of me is a draft of the September–October bulletin and I am intrigued by the fact that our congregation's name is still: *Or Chadash*, "New Light." After sixteen years you would think that we would not be "new" any more. What's more, after sixteen years, shouldn't our light be dimming a bit, flickering a little on and off? Does our bulb need replacing? Is being "new" even a value? If I am fine, if my life is fine, if my family is fine, do I need to shed a "new light" on my life to consider doing something different? Perhaps so.

Our Talmudic sages reflect on this as well. They raise the question, "Does a blind person have to recite the blessing over light?" Our tradition teaches that if you are to benefit from an object or an action, you recite a blessing. If a blind person can receive no benefit, then, perhaps he should not recite the blessing.

Rabbi Yossi (Megilla 24b) wondered: what difference is there, for a blind man, between light and darkness? Through an encounter he had with a blind man, walking at night and holding a torch, he found the answer to his question. Rabbi Yossi asked the blind man why he was carrying a torch; the torch would seem to have no use for him. The blind man answered that as long as he had a torch in his hand, others, who can see, would still be able to assist him. Also, if there happened to be a seeing person without a torch, he would be able to provide him with light.

A number of Talmudic rabbis were disabled: Nahum of Gimzo, Dosa ben Harkinas, Rav Joseph, and Rav Sheshet were all blind. This disability did not detract them from teaching values that would make a difference in the lives of their community.

We are taught that every Jew must light a *Ner Tamid* (perpetual burning flame) in their own heart (*Itturei Torah*). The perpetual, or re-'new'-ed light is not necessarily for our benefit, but it may benefit others. Let your *Or Chadash*, your "New Light," shine brightly for all to see, today and throughout the New Year.

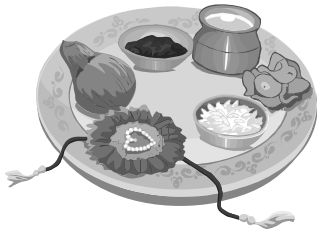

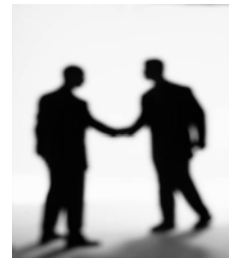

SERVICE SCHEDULE

All High Holy Day Services, except Selichot and Tashlich, are at the Jewish Community Center (3800 E. River Rd.)

SELICHOT

On Saturday, September 24th we come to our synagogues around the world to offer penitential prayers called *Selichot*. This is an evening of special introspection and preparation before Rosh Hashanah, four days later. Join our Rabbi and Cantor as we search and prepare together. We will gather in our community room at 9:00 p.m. as we change our Torah mantles from colored to pure white. We will then watch the award winning film, "The Quarrel" followed by a discussion on friendship and faith. We will then join members of other congregations at Bet Shalom at 10:00 p.m. for a special study opportunity and prayer service that will end at midnight.

CONTEMPORARY SERVICE

The service begins at 8:30 a.m. and the music features Cantor Cohen and members of our teen choir; a prayer book written at Or Chadash is used for this service. Many of our congregants serve as Torah readers. The service is accompanied by guitar and is a little less formal. This service will be led by Rabbi Thomas Louchheim and Cantor Janece Cohen and is for families with children over the age of eight.

Put in greased casserole and bake at 350 uncovered for 1 hour



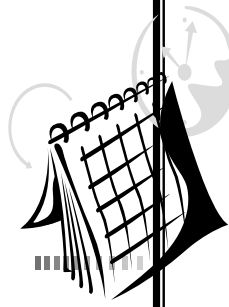
